## *Trash Collection Services*

In order to assist you in understanding trash and recycling pickup regulations, the following guidelines have been prepared. They cannot cover all circumstances, but should give you a better understanding of what the contractor will or will not pick up. When a situation arises that you are unsure of, please feel free to call City Hall at 330-684-5000, and we will try to help you.

Trash and recycling will be collected AT THE CURB once each week. Residents SOUTH of High Street (including those on High Street) will be serviced on **Thursdays**. All residents living NORTH of High Street will be serviced on **Fridays**. Please place containers, bags and bundles at curbside by 7 am, but not before 6 pm the prior evening. Curbside refers to that portion of right of way adjacent to the paved or traveled city roadways.

## *Preparing Items For Collection*

ALL refuse must be contained in plastic bags or rubbish containers not exceeding 35 gallons in size or 35 pounds in weight. Material not readily bagged may be placed out in bundles not exceeding 3 feet in length or 50 pounds in weight. For safety reasons, we ask that you refrain from placing broken glass or sharp objects loosely into plastic bags.

## *Large Items and Paint Disposal*

Large items such as stoves, refrigerators, water tanks, and furniture will be collected at curbside on your regular collection day. Appliances containing freon must be tagged by a certified technician that the freon has been properly removed before collection can occur. Paint in cans should have lids removed and paint permitted to air dry to a hard substance.

## *Recycling Collection Services*

Recycling collection is made the same day as the trash collection. All recycling bins must be at the curb by 7 a.m. Recyclables will be collected by a separate truck and taken to a recycling center to be prepared for resale. The following items are recyclable:

- Newspapers and magazines, glossy and non-glossy. May be bundled together with string.
- Corrugated cardboard and box board, such as cereal boxes, clothing boxes, detergent boxes, soda boxes, and packing boxes. No pizza boxes or any box contaminated with food.
- Aluminum cans. Please rinse.
- Steel & Bi-Metal Cans. Please rinse.
- Plastic. All plastic bottles numbered 1-2, plus all narrow mouth plastic containers numbered 3-7. Please rinse and remove neck rings.
- Glass. All green, clear and brown food and beverage containers. Please rinse. Labels may remain on bottle/jar.

## *Prohibited Items*

The following items are prohibited from regular pickup: Any hazardous waste/infectious waste, construction/demolition material, dirt, block, brick or concrete, tires, batteries, chemical/liquids, appliances containing freon.

The Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Solid Waste District offers a variety of other recycling opportunities such as household hazardous chemical collection, appliances collection and scrap tire collection. ## *Holiday Schedule*

The following holidays will be observed: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on a weekday before or on your collection day, your trash will be collected one day late. If the holiday falls after your collection day or on a weekend, your pick up schedule will not be affected.

## Yard Waste

The Orrville Compost Center, located at the end of Apple Avenue, is available to Orrville residents ONLY, and is open from April through October every year. It is open most Wednesdays during that time (weather permitting) from 7:30 AM to 11:15 AM and then 12:15 PM to 3:15 PM. There will be no access to the Compost Center other than Wednesdays. The site will accept only materials that will compost – leaves, grass, branches, shrub trimmings, and trees (excluding stumps and roots). The City will also have composted material – leaf mulch and wood chips – available for free to residents who wish to pick up during the time the site is open. Limited amounts of firewood are available. You will need to cut it yourself. There will be NO backhoe available for loading.

**The newest addition to the compost operation is the availability of Green Meadows Composting Center.** This is an EPA Class 3 Compost Facility which is located at 7541 Rohrer Road, approximately .3 miles west of North Millborne Road or approximately .3 miles east of Apple Creek Road. The driveway is on the south side, back a long farm lane near a white barn.

Green Meadows will operate a drop off day most Saturdays from 8 am to 1 pm. Anyone wishing to drop off at other times will need an appointment, by contacting Greg Piatt at [gmcomposting@earthlink.net](mailto:gmcomposting@earthlink.net). All Orrville residents may drop off for free by showing an ID. All loads will be inspected. The following items will be accepted: grass clippings, yard waste, limbs, leaves and sod. NO paper, plastic, rubber, or other items will be accepted, and all containers will be returned.

You may also use the Wayne County Office of Recycling at 4300 Mechanicsburg Road, Wooster. Their phone number is 330-669-3141.

## Leaves and Christmas Trees

Starting in November, the City will pick up leaves in Orrville. You should put them in the tree lawn area, between the sidewalk and the street curb. If your tree lawn is less than one foot deep, please put the leaves behind the sidewalk. Do NOT put the leaves in the street as they will clog the storm sewers and could cause backup into your home or neighboring homes. Watch the newspaper or see [www.orrville.com](http://www.orrville.com) for the leaf pickup schedule. Until the City starts leaf pickup in November, you may bag the leaves and put them out for the trash pickup, or take them to the Compost Site during their open hours.

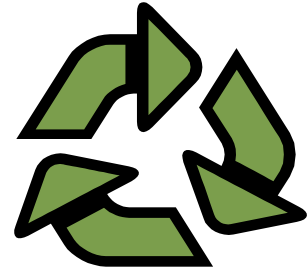
The City also provides the pickup of Christmas trees through the first week in January. Please place them at the curb and make sure all of the ornaments and lights have been removed. Do not leave plastic bags on the trees as they will be chipped.
