

<u>2023 Highlights</u>



- Officer's located a suspect in the theft of a catalytic convertor incident. LPR's were able to provide officers the plate of the suspect
- Officers were able to confirm at fault parties in several vehicle crashes
- Officers located the suspect in the theft of a firearm incident. Officers were then able to get a traffic stop on the vehicle involved
- Officer's were able to identify a subject who was dumping waste from his camper into the street. This individual was cited for the violation
- Officer's were able to determine the primary aggressor in a fight that had occurred at Bellstores
- Officer's were notified of a sexual assault that had just occurred, they were able to track the suspect entering the scene and then fleeing the area. Officers matched the subject with the description provided by the victim. Ultimately, officers were able to track down the subject where a foot pursuit ensued. The suspect was taken into custody and ultimately indicted for kidnapping and sexual imposition
- Officer's were able to track a 13 year old juvenile who was reported missing from the fireworks
- Officer's were able to identify a suspect who had vandalized the Orrville Skate Park
- Officer's were able to identify subjects involved in a large fight that had occurred in the Sheriff's Office jurisdiction
- Officer's were able to solve multiple OVI incidents. In both instances the crashes were captured on camera
- Assisted Medway in multiple investigations
- Alerts midnight shift to people in Orr Park after closing
- Officer's were able to track down a homicide suspects whereabouts after he fled the crime scene in the victims vehicle. The vehicle was located and the suspect was located in the vicinity of the vehicle and taken into custody





Handcuffing and Restraints

Topic: Use of Force

Scenario:

Man, I will be glad to get this guy booked, Officer Sarah Gorman thinks, looking at the prisoner in the back seat of her patrol vehicle. Kenneth Becker was the front seat passenger in a car Officer Gorman stopped about 30 minutes ago. It turned out that Mr. Becker was wanted for failing to appear on a traffic offense, so Officer Gorman told him he was under arrest. He was cordial at first, but the fight was on as soon as she pulled out her handcuffs.

Mr. Becker was hard to control, so Officer Gorman called for backup, and Officer Trenton Reed came to help. *He's not a very big man, but he sure is strong*, Officer Gorman thought as she caught her breath after they finally handcuffed Mr. Becker and placed him in the back of her vehicle.

"Hey, Trent. Can you follow me to the department in case he causes more trouble?" asks Officer Gorman.

"You bet," Officer Reed responds.

Mr. Becker yells nonstop during the drive, using foul language to express his unwillingness to go to jail and to blame Officer Gorman for his current dilemma.

Officer Gorman takes her eyes off the rearview mirror for a moment to look at slowing traffic ahead of her. Boom! Officer Gorman jumps, surprised by the loud sound at the cruiser's rear passenger door. *Did we just get hit*? she thinks, looking to the back seat to check on her prisoner. Immediately, she sees that the source of the loud sound was Mr. Becker kicking the rear passenger door of the vehicle. *How did he get out of his seat belt*? she wonders as Mr. Becker aims his next kick to the rear passenger window.

"Hey! Stop that!" Officer Gorman yells. "You're going to hurt yourself doing that!"

"I ain't going to jail!" responds Mr. Becker.

Officer Gorman flips on her overhead lights and whips to the side of the road. Officer Reed does the same, pulling his patrol vehicle behind hers.

Officer Gorman jumps out, rushes around the back of the vehicle and abruptly opens the rear passenger door. Mr. Becker's lower legs drop partially out of the open car door as he glares up at Officer Gorman.

"Looks like he's causing problems again," says Officer Reed as he walks up to the two of them.

"That's for sure," she says. "Will you help me restrain his legs so he doesn't try to kick out the window?"

"Happy to help," Officer Reed responds.





In 2020, the Orrville Police Department, in partnership with the Wayne County Juvenile Court and Catholic Charities, launched a pilot program in Orrville called the Youth Engagement Specialist (YES) Program.

The program provides officers with a single point of contact who can offer assistance to families with children who could benefit from social services.

In 2023, OPD made 68 referrals to the Y.E.S. Program.

Since the start of the program, OPD has made 185 referrals.




