## **ORDINANCE M-18**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Orrville, Ohio.

Section 1: Ohio, relating to overtime shall be amended to read as follows: That Section 151.02 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Orrville,

- 8 calendar year is one hundred twenty (120) hours and the maximum amount an employee may have banked at any one time shall not exceed four hundred eighty (480) hours. Compensatory time shall be scheduled the same as vacation time. The City will honor requests for the use of compensatory time within a reasonable period of time after the request has been made as long as said request does not unduly disrupt the normal operation of the department or cause the payment of overtime. Whenever practical, compensatory time is to be used within one (1) year of the date it has been earned or it is subject to being cashed out at the current hourly rate of pay. Employees may cash out compensatory time no more than four (4) times each calendar year by submitting a request on the City's Leave Form. Each request must be in increments of forty (40) hours. In addition, upon the retirement or termination of an employee, all banked compensatory time shall be cashed out at the employee, all banked employees, may earn compensatory time off in lieu of monetary over compensation. - Call-In Pay for Police Department Personnel.

  (1) Police Department employees called to work at a time other than their regularly scheduled working hours or on a day off shall receive a minimum of three hours work or three hours pay in lieu thereof, at the applicable overtime premium. However, when employees are called in immediately prior (three hours or less) to the start of their scheduled shift, they will be paid for actual time worked if less than one hour and do not apply when the normal work shift is extended at the end of the
- 2 applicable overtime rate regardless of the hearing location or jurisdiction. However, when employees are scheduled to appear in court immediately prior (three (3) hours or less) to the start of their scheduled shift, they will be paid for actual time worked if less than one hour and for three (3) hours if more than one (1) hour. If the court time occurs on a paid day off, an appropriate amount of leave time shall be restored to the employee. It is understood the employee twenty-four (24) hours prior to his/her scheduled appearance to determine if the officer is still required to appear. Court time shall not be paid to employees during regularly scheduled working hours.
