commonly known as a golf cart, with an attainable speed on a paved level surface of not more than twenty miles per hour and with a gross vehicle weight rating less than three thousand pounds as set forth in Ohio Revised Code §4501.01(XX). "Under-speed vehicle" means a three- or four-wheeled vehicle, including a vehicle

SECTION TWO

- Ņ Prior to the operation of an Under Speed Vehicle on City streets, the Under Speed of Public Safety. ("OPD") that complies with inspection requirements established by the Department Vehicle must pass an inspection conducted by the Orrville Police Department
- \mathbf{B} At the time of the inspection, the owner/operator of the Under Speed Vehicle must gross vehicle weight. present the following to OPD: (1) a valid driver's license, (2) proof of insurance relating to the use of the Under Speed Vehicle, (3) proof of registration, and (4)
- Ω If an Under Speed Vehicle passes inspection, the owner/operator will be permitted to operate the Under Speed Vehicle on City streets.
- D. The OPD shall have the right to not issue a permit to any applicant for any or no reason. Further, the OPD shall have the right to revoke any permit, for any or no reason, that had been previously issued.

Prior to the operation of an Under Speed Vehicle on City streets, the vehicle must be registered in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4503, and titled in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4505. Out-of-state Under Speed Vehicles are not permitted on City streets.

SECTION FOUR

- A windshield;
- 5. Brakes and a brake system;
- 6. A steering mechanism; and
- 7 unsafe condition. Appropriate tires that are free of major bumps, bulges, breaks, or any other
- 8. Must have one (1) seat belt per occupant of the vehicle

SECTION SIX

is/are operating a municipal vehicle in accordance with his/her/their official duties employees shall be exempted from this Ordinance as long as the municipal employee(s) separate violation.
