Safety Service Department Director Wheeler: Asphalt street project paving is complete. The ODOT East Pine Street project is complete. The ODOT Main Street is complete. Ongoing is the OPWC West High Street project. The ADA ramps and curbs will be worked on over the next couple of weeks. October 21, the intersection of Crown Hill and High will be converted into concrete due to the high truck traffic. The Vine Street concrete portion is completed and the hump has been evened out. The asphalt overlay, mill and fill, should go quickly once they get started.

Utilities Director Brediger: Public Power Week and the value of local ownership and local control brings value and benefit to our customers and community by economic development and lower rates. On behalf of the electric department employees that serve our over 6400 residential customers and 900 industrical and commercial customers, we thank the community for their support.
